

Jordan/Rustin Coalition was created in response to the lack of outreach to African Americans in the campaign against Proposition 22, the anti-gay marriage initiative in 2000, and the realization in 2005 that another such initiative was imminent. The group was envisioned to engage the African-American community to work on marriage equality while building a movement of LGBT African Americans and allies who are committed to grassroots organizing. JRC has initiated a non-partisan community mobilization project for Black Lesbian, Gay, Bisexual, and Transgender people and allies to engage African American communities in Los Angeles about marriage equality. The goals of JRC are two fold: A) to educate the wider African American community about who black LGBT people are and why they deserve to be protected by marriage and B) to recruit and develop a core team of LGBT and allied African Americans who will lead the implementation of an African American strategy. What Will the Next 10 Years Bring?

Ten years! One whole decade has passed and In The Meantime has continued its unending and dedicated service to our community. I especially remember the early visioning sessions and discussions I had with ITMT Founder, Jeffrey King. When Jeffrey spoke about ITMT I saw that he did it from a place of passion and commitment to community. Seeing and hearing Jeffrey's commitment made me feel obligated and thus, I eagerly joined the Board and subsequently served as a President.

The 10th Anniversary that ITMT is celebrating is more than a symbolic milestone, rather it is an important statement that the organization has continued to be relevant. ITMT has grown from being a weekly support group into a significant and comprehensive health and wellness organization and I am proud to have served during some of the organization's most important foundation-laying years. While I may not be involved in day-to-day functions as before, I am still deeply impacted by my previous service and further inspired by its continued growth potential.

While ITMT has done a tremendous job over the last 10

years, its work is not yet fulfilled as the support system is probably needed now more than ever. The sad truth is that nothing about our realities as Black gay men has changed in the last 10 years. Not only are we still at higher risk for health disparities, we are still an "open target" for bigotry, hatred and attack. Our individual character and integrity can still be easily maligned if we openly identify as gay or same gender loving.

As ITMT moves into a second decade of community service, it is my hope that the organization continues to work on health and wellness issues, but I also challenge the organization and members of the community to be louder and bolder. I still believe that ITMT's primary role as a system of support for like-minded brothers should be a driving force for the organization, but advocacy and public discourse about fairness and equality for Black gay men should also be thought of when the organization's name is mentioned.

So, as we celebrate the last 10 years of service, let us also contemplate what the next 10 years will bring.

All have become the Diaspora that creates In The Meantime.

It is this patchwork quilt of personalities, achievements, and beautiful faces that gives the organization its pulse, that causes this entity to thrive, and that propels it into becoming the essential Tao for the Black gay experience in Los Angeles.

Through the past ten years this fragment of consciousness has been shaped and reshaped, like a potter throwing clay onto a wheel, with visceral touch and hands working in the crafting of a beautiful masterpiece that continually changes and takes new shape and evolves with every revolution of the wheel.

The Tao of In The Meantime has made an indelible imprint on the social construct of brothers in Los Angeles, and shall continue to survive and flourish for many years to come.



“There’s no place like home.” I learned that “home is where the heart is,” and any organization that has the heart and compassion to truly cater to the underserved population of Black gay/bi/SGL men without reservation for the past 10 years, truly is home. That is what In The Meantime is to me.

My name is Greg Wilson, and I am 27 years old. In The Meantime is the first and only organization that gave me my first chance and first shot in this field. In The Meantime realized from the start that “home is where the heart is” and with my heart and passion, Jeffrey King believed I would be ideal for reaching the youth in our community. For two years at In The Meantime, I learned, grew, taught and helped so many that I now consider family and friends. I learned a whole lot in a short time. Being a part of the house and ball community for almost eight years, In The Meantime not only

created that platform but also the programs and services needed that allowed me to reach the kids and community that was being overlooked.

For the past year and a half, I have been working at REACH LA, a non-profit youth-based organization, and I now manage all of the young men’s health programs including counseling, prevention, testing, outreach, event planning and, most importantly, the Ovahnness Young Men’s Leadership team. This allows me the opportunity to train and assist 20 young men with their development and growth, and assisting them with becoming advocates for themselves and other youth in the community. It feels good to be able to give back and to furnish some of the things I wasn’t provided.

I truly value the work and efforts of In The Meantime, and I feel blessed to be a part of the historic 10 years of the life changing work that has been done in the community...and as I still volunteer and fully participate in all events and activities, all I keep saying in my mind is that there’s “no place like home.”

- **Membership Development:** Building a clearer role and vision for the Board, hosting development opportunities and expanding board membership.


- **Capacity Building:** Creation and development of the Community Advisory Board, facilitating a new hiring process for prospective employees and continuing work on the 10-step strategic plan.
